

it as tutors to counsel and assist the boys in their studies during evening study period. There is also a Matron to look after the Boys of Junior Houses. All the Houses are provided with telephones for the boys to receive calls during the prescribed time. The houses have well maintained toilets and all basic amenities.

Boys Mess & Bakery

16. Boys eat their meals in a spacious common dining hall known as Almeida Hall. Both vegetarian and non-vegetarian food is served in the Mess. All the Masters dine with them to ensure polite behaviour and discipline during meals. They also teach the boys proper eating habits and correct table manners. Due care is taken to provide a balanced and nutritious diet to the boys everyday.



Students Participation in School Affairs

17. Students participate effectively in the management of their House, Boys Mess, Games & Sports, Cultural activities etc. The suggestions made by the students are given due consideration by the School Authorities. Boys from Senior Classes are given School



appointments for exercising their organising ability and developing qualities of leadership.

CSD Canteen and Tuck Shop

18. The School runs a CSD canteen. The School also has a Tuck Shop, where items of day to day necessity are provided at market rate.



Swimming Pool, Squash Court & Skating Rink

22. Swimming pool with all modern facilities including a water treatment plant is also available. Swimming is taught as an extra curricular activity to the boys. There is also a Skating Rink and a Squash Court.



Shooting Club

23. The school has an Indoor and Outdoor Air Rifle Shooting range. The club is affiliated to National Rifle Association of India and the boys take part in various competitions.

Modern Educational Aids

24. Apart from using innovative techniques to impart education, the School has educational aids like LCD Over Head Projectors. Computer Education is imparted to all students from Class VI onwards. Computer Science is also available in lieu of Biology as an elective subject in Class XI and XII.



Eligibility and Pattern of Entrance Examination

25. Admission to the School is Primarily open to Andhra Domicile boys. The boys are admitted according to the seats available at the beginning of the year. Applications are to be submitted online mode only. The Entrance Examination will be on OMR based system which has Multiple Choice questions with four options.

(a) **Admission to Class VI.** Only those boys who have completed 10 years but not 12 years as on 31 March of the year of admission are eligible. Medium of examination will be English or any other recognised Indian Language. Question papers for Class VI will be supplied in the Medium as indicated in the application form.

(b) **Admission to Class IX.** Only those boys who have completed 13 years but not 15 years as on 31 March of the Year of admission are eligible for admission to Class IX. For admission to Class IX the boy should be studying in class VIII in a recognised School. The question papers are set in English only. However, the candidates have the option to answer in any recognised Regional Language as indicated by them in the Application Form except English Paper. The pattern of question paper may vary from year to year.



Method of Evaluation

26. The Entrance Examination consists of a OMR based examination. The written papers for Class VI and Class IX will be as under :-

27. Medium of Examination for both the above examinations will be English, Hindi or any other recognised official language. The question papers for Class VI will continue to be set in English and all the recognized Official Languages. But Question Papers for Class IX will be set in English Language only.

28. The Minimum qualifying marks for General Category candidates as well as children of Defence Service personnel and ex-servicemen will be 25% in each subject with 40% in aggregate unless these qualifying standards are revised or changed by issue of written directions by the Honorary Secretary, Sainik Schools Society, Ministry of Defence. In the case of SC/ST candidates, the minimum qualifying standards are not required and they will be admitted on the basis of inter-se-merit at the entrance examination / interview within these categories. In case of SC/ST candidates comes in the general merit on his own, he would be admitted against general seat and will not be adjusted against the reserved share of SC/ST seats.

29. The merit list for admission to the Sainik School would be compiled on the basis of total marks. In case there is a tie with regard to overall marks, the mark for mathematics would be considered. In case there is a tie here also, the marks for English for Class IX and intelligence Test for Class VI will be considered and thereafter the marks for General Science for Class IX and Language for Class VI. In case there is tie there also, the boy younger in age will be selected.
